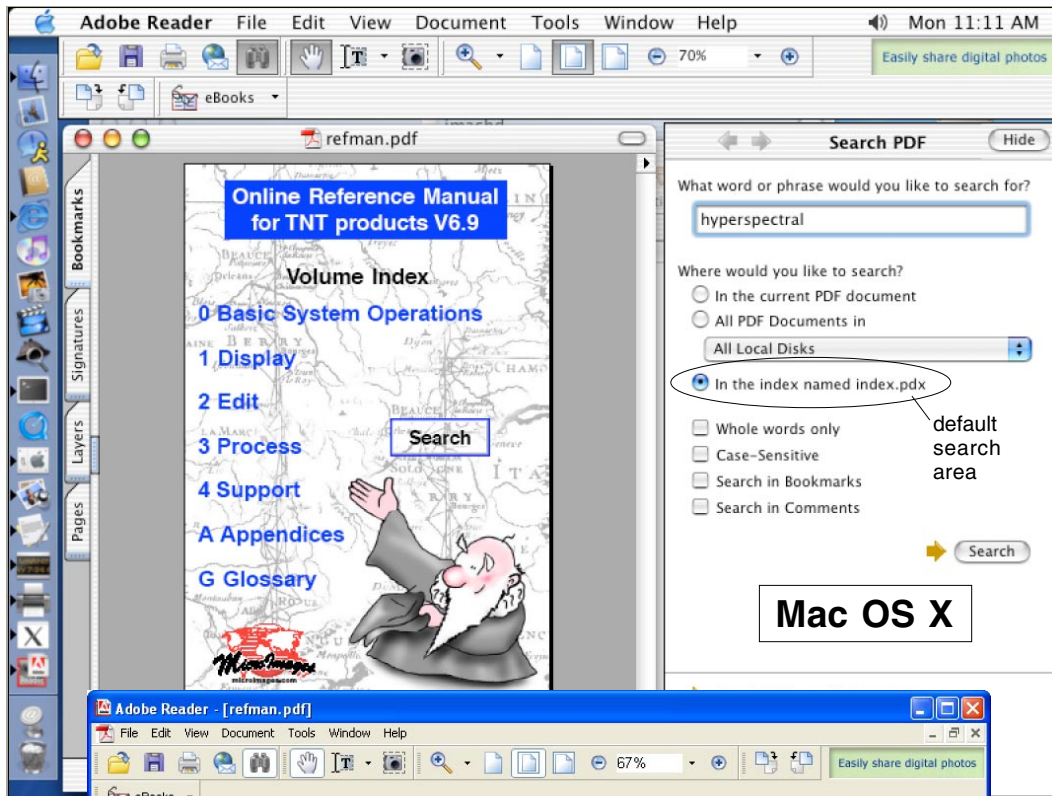
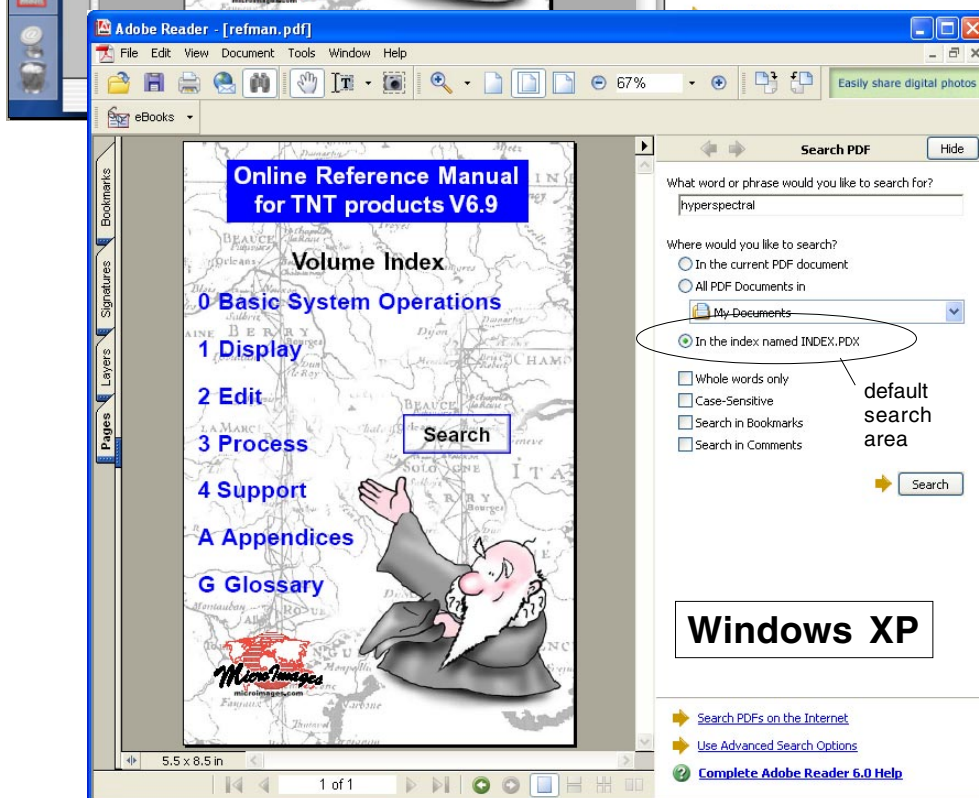


Searching with the Index in Adobe Reader

One of the features available for the TNT products' documentation is the pre-built index that allows you to quickly search both the Online Reference Manual and all tutorial booklets for any word or topic you enter. However, when this feature was initially implemented Acrobat Reader on the Macintosh did not support use of this index, which made searching time consuming and inconvenient on this platform. The ability to use the pre-built index on the Mac is now supported by Adobe Reader 6.0, which is available for free download from Adobe's web site (to which there is a link from the documentation page on MicroImages' web site).



When you open the Online Reference Manual (Display / Reference Manual) or the Search page (Help / Search) in Adobe Reader 6.0 or later, the pre-built index is automatically selected as the search area. Clicking on the Search button in either of these documents opens the Search PDF panel with the option to search in the associated, pre-built index turned on. Searches with the pre-built index typically take about a second. Other search options do not let you search both the Online Reference Manual and the tutorials at the same time and each of these searches takes about one minute plus search setup time. If the TNT products launch a PDF viewer other than Adobe Reader when you make the menu selections referred to above, you will need to open Adobe Reader then select the desired document (refman.pdf or search.pdf).



Searching with Adobe Acrobat 5.x using the pre-built index is supported by V6.9 of the TNT products. This backward compatibility may not be retained in future releases of the TNT products.
